Welcome

We're so glad you're here! At the welcome table outside the sanctuary (the table with the jade plant), you can find name tags, information, and sensory items.

Multigenerational Worship

We are a multigenerational church and welcome children as full participants in our community. Adults are practicing hospitality by welcoming the noise and wiggles of our youngest worshipers; children are practicing reverence by using whispers and quiet movements (parents, please help them practice!). We're all becoming like little children in God's kingdom.

This summer, we offer the following:

- **Wild Wonder!** Throughout the summer we'll gather at 10:30am on the playground after church for Wild Wonder, a casual time of creation appreciation for all ages.
- **Mustard Seed Atrium (ages 0-4).** Nursery care for our youngest children is available at 9:00am in the Nursery (follow signs in the hallway). Children should be picked up at the Peace so that the whole community can celebrate the Eucharist together.
- There are many spots where parents and children can take a break together as needed: right outside the sanctuary in the narthex, the nursery, courtyard, fellowship hall, or the playground.
- Parents or caregivers with infants in arms may use the sanctuary balcony, but it's not a suitable spot for mobile children.

Child Safety in a new space. As we become accustomed to sharing a building with another congregation and a preschool, parents and all community members should remain aware of our child-protection policy (incarnationanglican.org/safe-community). **No children should be left unattended,** and all activities and interactions should be visible and in the open.

The Lessons

Old Testament Reading: Deuteronomy 30:15-20

"See, I have set before you today life and prosperity, death and adversity. If you obey the commandments of the Lord your God that I am commanding you today, by loving the Lord your God, walking in his ways, and observing his commandments, decrees, and ordinances, then you shall live and become numerous, and the Lord your God will bless you in the land that you are entering to possess. But if your heart turns away and you do not hear but are led astray to bow down to other gods and serve them, I declare to you today that you shall certainly perish; you shall not live long in the land that you are crossing the Jordan to enter and possess. I call heaven and earth to witness against you today that I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Choose life so that you and your descendants may live, loving the Lord your God, obeying him, and holding fast to him, for that means life to you and length of days, so that you may live in the land that the Lord swore to give to your ancestors, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob."

The first reading is typically from the Old Testament (the Hebrew Scriptures), which Jesus knew and from which he often quoted.

The four Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John) tell the life, teachings, death, and resurrection of Jesus. We stand to hear them as a sign of our reverence for Christ the Word. We read the Gospels in the midst of the people because "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us."

New Testament Reading: Philemon 4-21

I thank my God always when I mention you in my prayers, because I hear of your love for all the saints and your faith toward the Lord Jesus. I pray that the partnership of your faith may become effective as you comprehend all the good that we share in Christ. I have indeed received much joy and encouragement from your love, because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed through you, my brother.

For this reason, though I am more than bold enough in Christ to command you to do the right thing, yet I would rather appeal to you on the basis of love—and I, Paul, do this as an old man and now also as a prisoner of Christ Jesus. I am appealing to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I have become during my imprisonment. Formerly he was useless to you, but now he is indeed useful to you and to me. I am sending him, that is, my own heart, back to you. I wanted to keep him with me so that he might minister to me in your place during my imprisonment for the gospel, but I preferred to do nothing without your consent in order that your good deed might be voluntary and not something forced. Perhaps this is the reason he was separated from you for a while, so that you might have him back for the long term, no longer as a slave but more than a slave, a beloved brother—especially to me but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord.

So if you consider me your partner, welcome him as you would welcome me. If he has wronged you in any way or owes you anything, charge that to me. I, Paul, am writing this with my own hand: I will repay it. I say nothing about your owing me even your own self. Yes, brother, let me have this benefit from you in the Lord! Refresh my heart in Christ. Confident of your obedience, I am writing to you, knowing that you will do even more than I ask.

The Nicene Creed

All We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, visible and invisible.

Sanctus means "holy" in Latin. We join the song of the saints and angels who praise God without ceasing, as described in Isaiah 6:3 and Revelation 4:8.

The Prayer of Consecration

Leader Almighty God, owner of all things . . . On the same night that he was betrayed he took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples saying, "Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

People Amen! His body was broken for us.

Leader In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave thanks; he gave it to them, saying, "Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."
